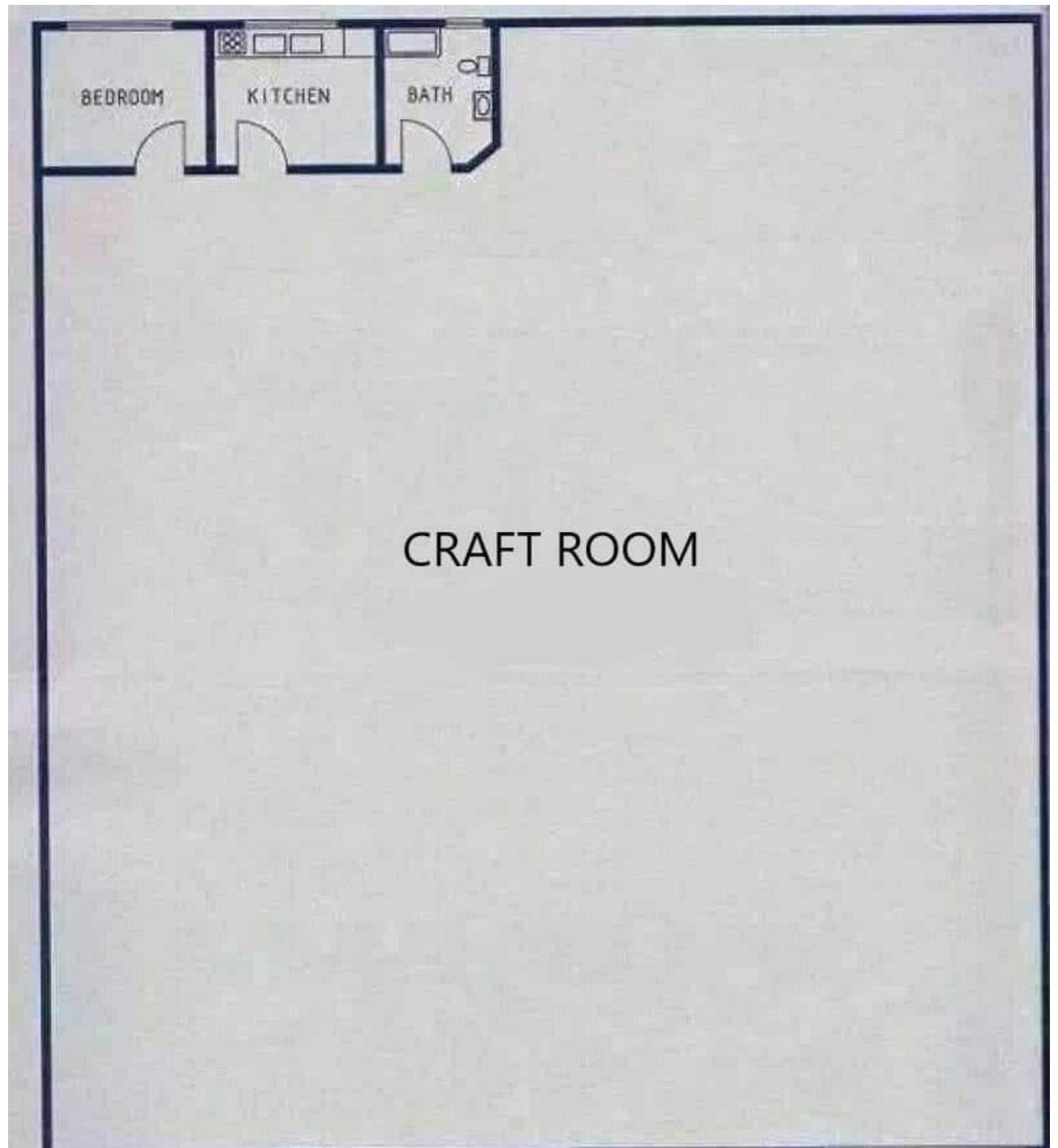




Cathey Newhouse – using MaryBajcz’s free-cut techniques and Helen Godden’s style of quilting each section differently.

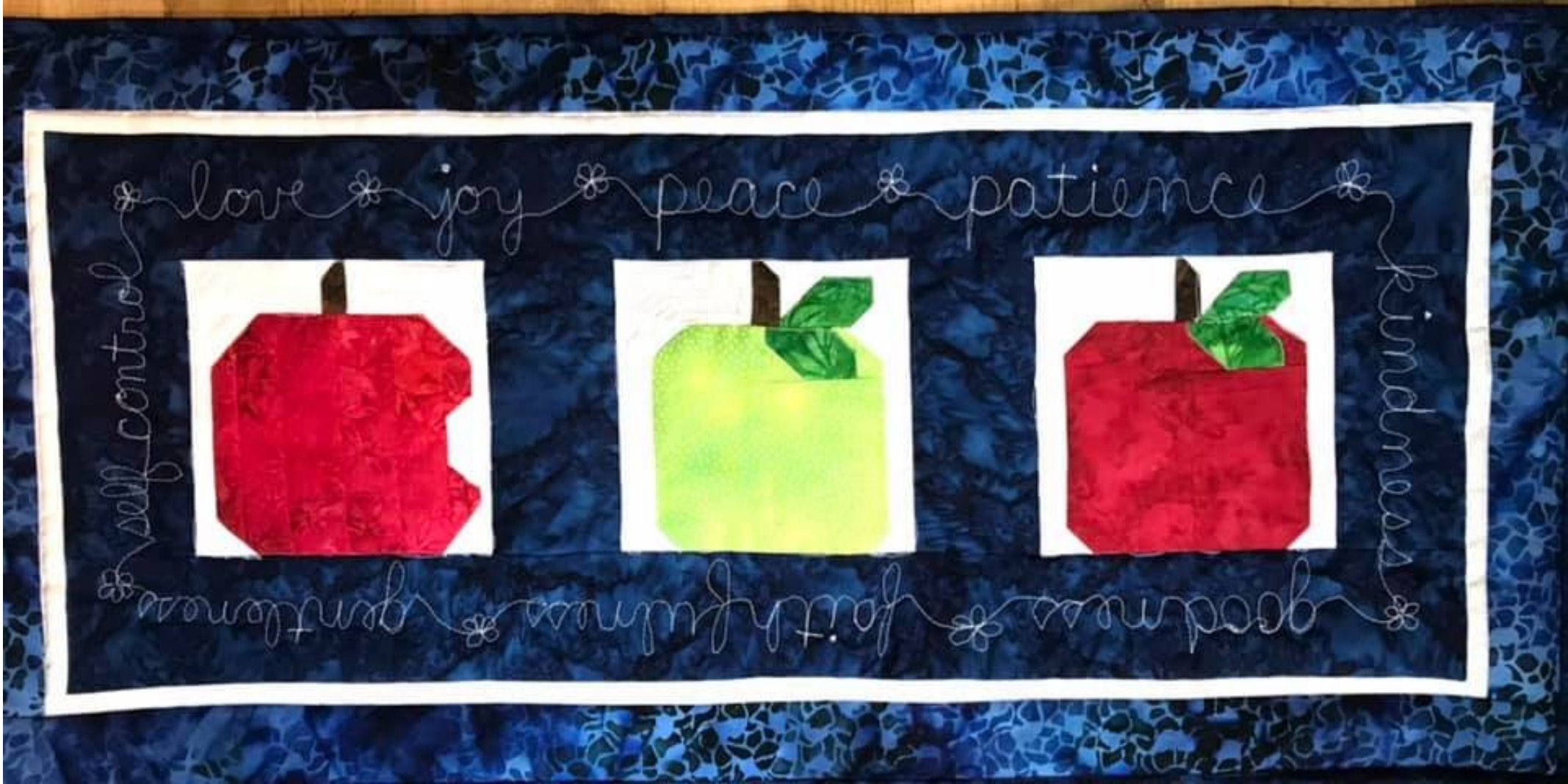
