Upcoming Programs and Workshops

In February, Deborah Strain will be here to speak to us about the process of fabric design. Deb has been a designer for Moda fabrics for over 20 years and has created over 100 fabric collections for them. She will share how her hand

drawn and hand painted artwork evolves into lovely fabric for Moda. You can take a look at some of Deb's fabric collections she has designed at https://my.modafabrics.com/designers/deb-strain

In March, Pat Yamin, founder of Come Quilt With Me, will be here. For more than 40 years, Pat has been designing quilt patterns and templates, making quilts, judging, lecturing and



teaching quilt making, and has written several books. Pat has appeared on many TV and radio shows. Her company manufacturers acrylic templates that assure accuracy and shorten the time necessary to make a quilt. Pat will be talking to us about Hexagons, Diamonds, Triangles & Quilts. Did you know most quilters love math and have always used basic squares, hexagons, diamonds for patterns? Many antique quilts were made from fabric women already had – old shirts, aprons, dresses, curtains, etc. Pat's lecture and collection of antique quilts from the late 1800s take you back in time as she shares their wonderful histories. See how they survived time and wear, and how hexagons and diamond quilt patterns from our grandmother's era are popular today.

There will be a workshop using the pattern Seven Starry Sisters (see picture on next page). Seven Starry Sister's is a pattern Pat took from one of her antique quilts. She changed it a bit to make it simpler to piece. Everybody loves stars!! This pattern is one of the most popular star patterns available. Working with diamonds that make their own hexagons, then adding triangles and hexagons, turns this quilt into a real show stopper. Pat's acrylic templates make for easy and accurate rotary cutting and sewing. This is one you don't want to miss. The templates and instruction booklet are \$30 and must be purchased for the workshop.



Superior Threads Bad Habits

Superior Threads suggests that there are some things that quilters should stop doing. Do you have any of these bad habits?

Not organizing your fabric scraps Too much criticism Cutting the same place on your mat Sewing over pins Not maintaining your machine Unthreading the machine incorrectly Using dull cutting tools Using low-quality thread and fabrics

Did You Know?

Don't prewash precuts smaller than fat quarters. It can cause the fabric pieces to stretch out of shape and fray, making them harder to sew with.

Use the chart on page 14 to determine the number of squares that can be cut from various precuts. Yardage figures include ¹/₄" seam allowances. The figures on this chart are mathematically accurate.
