Upcoming Programs

We have some exciting programs coming up in the next few months. Our September program will be a game night along with some housekeeping news. We will not have a workshop in September. We will be too busy getting ready for the quilt show.

In October, Carol Stygles will be visiting with us to discuss "Plant to Print - An Introduction to Natural Dyes and Eco Dyeing". She will be talking about basic knowledge of plants, mordants (I had to look it up – a mordant or dye fixative is a substance used to set dyes on fabrics by forming a coordination complex with the dye, which then attaches to the fabric. It may be used for dyeing fabrics or for intensifying stains in cell or tissue preparations), and textiles. Carol will also cover the best plants for this, how to prepare the fabric, tips and techniques, samples of dyed fabrics, and much more!!

We will be having a workshop on November 1st (It's after the quilt show, so we will all be ready for some fun!!). Mary Jane Erwin will be doing a workshop for us on "Inktense Pencils". Mary Jane is planning on a couple projects for the workshop – the first one is to familiarize the participants with basic techniques to using the pencils. The second project will be more

advanced teaching blending of colors. There will be a kit for this workshop. This workshop will fill up fast, so be sure to sign up soon.



Jean Dalton will be visiting us in November. You might remember that Jean was originally scheduled to do a presentation on "Featherweights – Singer's Little Gems" in January 2022, but her presentation was cancelled due to Ella Sharp Museum being closed due to Covid. Jean will also be doing a workshop on "Featherweights - Advanced Maintenance".

And then its December (I can't believe how fast time is going) and there will **not** be a meeting/workshop.

The 2022 Quilt Show Entry Form is available for use! Thank you to Karen Prater for emailing the form to Guild members and for putting it on the Guild website. A link to the form is included in this month's newsletter.

Following are several questions that have been emailed to me:

Q: What is the size for a miniature quilt? A: The dimensions for a miniature quilt are anything 24" square and smaller. Miniature quilts will be hung on sheets using pins.

Q: Are there instructions for making the 4 ½" hanging sleeve for quilts larger than miniature quilts?

A: Cindy Shong arranged a demo at the July meeting on how to make the hanging sleeve. If you missed that demo, please check the internet, YouTube, or

check with one of the quilt show committee members for information on how to make the sleeve. Your quilt sisters are always a good resource too! The entry form includes a space for you to include information regarding your quilt. This information will be included on the card that is pinned to your quilt project. Enter as many quilt projects as you wish, however each quilt needs an entry form.

If you are interested in selling your quilt, please indicate that on the form along with the price. Any exchange of money in your quilt sale is between the seller and buyer.

Anyone needing help to print pictures of your quilt, please reach out to me and I'll get you connected with someone who can assist.

As a reminder, quilt show entry forms are due by August 30, 2022. There are many methods for submitting the form to me. Please contact me at rjnelson2019@gmail.com or 517-416-0539 with questions. Happy quilting and good luck!

QUILTERS ARE ARTISTS TOO – 2022 QUILT SHOW ENTRY FORM

GUIDELINES FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES

- 1. Each entry requires a separate Entry Form. Copy or print as many as you need.
- 2. Quilts may only be submitted by an active member of the Pieces & Patches Quilt Guild.
- 3. Quilts must be made by a guild member in order to be eligible for the "People's Choice" Award.
- 4. Forms must be received by the end of August 30, 2022.
- 5. As there are a limited number of racks to accommodate large quilts, large quilts will be placed based on entry date (first come basis).
- 6. Members may enter more than one quilt in the show. If there is not sufficient room to accommodate all entries that have been submitted, you may be contacted to prioritize entries.
- 7. Quilts (other than miniatures) must have a 4½" hanging sleeve to enable hanging on the racks. (Miniatures will be pinned to curtains handing from the racks).
- 8. Each quilt must be submitted in its own cloth bag (one cloth bag per entry, regardless of the quilt size) and must have a label sewn or pinned to the cloth bag <u>and</u> back of the quilt with the person's name and the name of the quilt.

HINTS FOR COMPLETING ENTRY FORM

- 1. Completing form **electronically**:
 - a. Download the Microsoft Word version of the form.
 - b. Click on each box to enter requested information.
 - c. Insert a picture of the quilt.
 - d. Save your file to whatever name you choose.
 - e. E-mail your document to rjnelson2019@gmail.com
 - f. If submitting more than one quilt, download the form again (or edit your existing document) and save it to a new name.
 - 2. Completing the form in hard copy:
 - a. Download and print the form. Print one for each quilt you are entering.
 - b. Please print legibly and complete the form.
 - c. Attach a picture in the upper left corner. Picture does NOT need to be large or on special photo paper.
 - d. Submit your form to Renee Nelson at a guild meeting, mail it to 116 Edgewater Drive, Michigan Center, 49254, OR scan the completed document and email it to rjnelson2019@gmail.com.



Bearded Batting

At the July 25, 2022 PPQG meeting our speaker, Lyn Heilman remotely presented an interesting and informative lecture on quilt batting and their various properties.

I had a terrible problem with a quilt that, after washing, bearded up on both sides of the quilt. (See pics on page 15) I could not recall what type of batting I had used but was quite sure it was not the usual 80/20 cotton/poly that I normally use. submitted a question as to what might have caused this. Lyn was not able to see the quilt but responded that some possible causes of bearding were a dull needle used by the long-arm quilter or loosely woven fabric. I was skeptical that either of these were the cause of my problem. Kris Rulison, who has longarm quilted several of my quilts (but not this one) was curious and researched it for me. This was the information she found. I think it is a valid explanation to the bearding problem on my quilt. I think it may be useful to others who are considering using wool batting.

I thought I'd share my experience and the response I rec'd from Quilters Dream regarding the wool batting bearding through the lion quilt I made for my son.

I used black fabric and a darker red and the bearding was DREADFUL on both front and back of the quilt after washing/drying. I was devastated and emailed the company with the photos. I purchased one of those sweater shaver things and used that over the entire quilt - front and back. It helped quite a bit, but it will never be the same as when I made it I'm sure. :-(

There was no bearding on any of the gold fabrics. Below is the copy/pasted response from QD Customer Service.

"We have found that many high quality fabric manufacturers use a sulfur-based chemical in their dyeing process (especially when dying dark and vivid colors like reds and dark blues). The sulfur is very good for fabrics because the sulfur molecule is five-sided, which causes a strong bond and makes the colors very color-fast. The disadvantage to the "attraction" created by having 5 sides is that more surfaces promote static electricity. (When you wear dark colors or a very vivid print, have you noticed that pet hairs and fuzz balls seem to stick to you? It isn't your imagination – the sulfur has caused a static charge making everything stick.) In quilting, the combination of motion, handling, and weather (especially dry climates, machine dryers, or dry winter heating) will increase the static, causing the fibers of batting to 'stand up' like the hair on our arms and be drawn to the fabric.

The solution is to break the static charge. You can use an anti-static spray, such as Static Guard both on finished and unfinished quilts. If you don't have an anti-static spray, put a few anti-static dryer sheets in a spray bottle with water and sprits both the fabric and the batting (or the finished quilt). This will not



cause the fibers to pull back in, but it will prevent more from bearding through. You can use a sweater shaver or lint roller to remove the batting "balls" from the surface once you have thoroughly sprayed the quilt with anti-static spray.

When you wash your quilt, use fabric softeners in the washer and anti-static sheets in the dryer. It is also helpful to remove the quilt from the dryer before it is totally dry and hang it. Do not store the finished quilt or your quilts-in-progress in regular plastic bags as this really promotes static electricity. Using a humidifier in the workplace not only cuts down on static, but is great for your skin! The anti-static spray really works well in my own experience - a dark purple quilt that I had problems with completely stopped bearding after I sprayed it.

I hope this information is helpful and that you will not run across this problem ever again – it is truly the exception."
