

#### President's Block


As a thank you to the President of the Guild each year we like to present them with a President's Block that they can later put together into a quilt. This year Bev Smith has chosen a Simple 9 patch block. Her request is that it is a scrappy block, but with NO BATIKS. This can be presented any time between now and September, and please remember to put your name in permanent ink so that she knows who made which block. Thank you for all of your work for the Guild, Bev!


Simple 9 Patch Block Instructions Cut 5 - 4" dark colored blocks and 4 – 4" light colored blocks.

Sew two darks to one light to make two rows Sew two lights to one dark to make one row Sew together as shown below.

This should make an 11" unfinished block. (Please use scrappy fabric, but NO BATIKS)

# In Remembrance

Recently we lost a very special member of our Guild. Sadly, on Tuesday, April 4, 2023 Sharon Bannister passed away. Since that time, we have heard many wonderful stories about Sharon, some of which we would like to share with you. Sharon joined the Guild in 2003. Her



excellent quilting talents and skills quickly became apparent along with her very generous willingness to share those skills. Linda Mumby said "I always made sure I took any class Sharon taught because I knew I would learn so much. I loved the way she taught her classes. She was always so caring and helpful to each student."

Guild members remember Sharon as very strong, quiet and modest. Anne Richards said, "I was a friend of Sharon's for many years and she always had a beautiful smile and an encouraging word for others. I had the pleasure of attending many retreats and classes with Sharon. I never heard Sharon say a negative word about anyone. She was always so positive and generous." "Sharon was always up for new challenges," said Linda Burke, "even when we found the ¼" hexies on the take me table." Elvia Shirkey said, "She was always there for her friends with a listening ear. Sharon didn't give a biased direction, just constant positive support. She was the kind of person that made you want to do better."

Sharon was an applique artist who spent much of her time making quilts for others. Most of her work included hearts somewhere on the quilts. Because of her excellent quilting skills, she frequently contributed in major ways towards making the Guild quilt show raffle quilts.

She also served on the Board as President, Vice President, Member at Large, Director and Historian. For many years Sharon took the photos of the quilt show quilts as well as the Show & Tell quilts at Guild meetings which in turn helped to preserve the history of our Guild. We are fortunate to have several scrapbooks of photos taken by Sharon to help document the Guild's story.

Sharon raised three boys on her own. She made sure that each of her children and grandchildren all had quilts. She also did many other crafts with her grandchildren and great grandchildren. Her extended family was very important to her. She had two sisters and a brother. Sharon and her sisters loved



to do crafts together – everything from paper, ceramics and paint pours. Sharon also loved fishing. She often went over to the west side of Michigan to fish with her brother and cousins. Sharon retired from MACI after 25 years. She was in charge of parts in the Maintenance Department. She created



manuals and helped implement a new computer system. Sharon went on a bucket list road trip to Savannah, Georgia and Florida with her son and daughter-in-law about a year ago after recovering from a very serious illness.

While we are all asked to give back to the Guild, Sharon gave back in so many ways that were above and beyond the norm. In addition to teaching classes and serving on the Board, Sharon participated in several sit and stitch groups including the Woolies group, a founding member of the It's Not Your Momma's Quilting Group, and the for many years, the leader of the Miniatures Group. She also had a sewing group at her church. She sewed every day.

Sharon entered her beautiful quilts in many competitions and won many awards. In 2016 Sharon completed a miniature quilt that was a pattern from Edyta Sitar's book, A Handful of Scraps. Sharon's Flower Garden quilt was made of 1/4" hexagons. This quilt took 2nd place at our 2016 Quilt Show



and then went on to be accepted at the AQS Paducah Show. In addition, the Quilting Digest April 2018 magazine featured Sharon's Flower Garden Quilt. In Sharon's typical very generous way, she gifted this amazing quilt to Edyta Sitar, the original designer. Sharon also won many awards at the Sauder Village Quilt Shows including a Silk Ribbon Quilt that won Viewer's Choice award.



Sharon touched so many lives in such a positive way, not only her family but her many friends. The Pieces and Patches Quilt Guild has been blessed to have had Sharon as a very special member for so many years. She will be greatly missed.

In loving memory of <u>Sharon Bannister</u>, her family plans to celebrate her life by sharing some thoughts, stories, and memories, they will have some of her


