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

English Paper Piecing Sit 'n Stitch Update

At the November Guild meeting, I mentioned that I would be looking into starting a Sit 'n Stitch group specific to English Paper Piecing. I have a list started of Guild members interested in joining this group. I'm still working on selecting a date, time, and venue. Please stay tuned for updates.

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Blotto is back. What is Blotto?

Blotto is a block lottery. It is used in many guilds as an opportunity for members try a new block, be creative and to use up some of their fabric stash. The blocks can be used by the winners to start a quilt for themselves or for charity.

Rules:

- All blocks must be turned in prior to the beginning of the meeting designated as Blotto night.
- Members can enter up to 3 different blocks.
 Please add a piece of paper with your name with each entry for the drawing.
- A member may win once per block theme.
- If you're unable to attend the meeting, blocks may be sent with a representative for Blotto night.
- Please use quality cotton (not fabrics from Hobby Lobby or Joann's unless it's a designer quilt fabric).

• First winner drawn will get the first choice of a block grouping. The more participation the more blocks you can WIN!!!!!!

Fabric cuts:

Background: 8 (3.5 inch) squares cream fabric, please no muslin

X squares: 4 (5.5 inch) cotton small to medium print Cross: 1 (2.5 x 6.5 inches)

2 (2.5 x 2.5 inches) a bright color fabric to help pop the center

Cross Ends: 4 (2.5 x 3.5) your choice Unfinished block measures 12.5 inches

••••You will also be able to make 2 (5 inch) pinwheel blocks from the corner please share with your entry if you can.

X Plus block Blotto

To assemble:

• Take 1 print square and in opposite corners place 2 cream blocks. Sew corner to corner and trim a slight quarter inch seam. •••••Save your trimmed off pieces to sew 1/2 square triangles. These can form your bonus pinwheel blocks. •••••

- Sew cross ends to cross center pieces.
- Assembly- take and sew 2 X blocks with 2 short cross pieces for each side. Then attach to center cross strip piece.

You are done!!!!! Blotto lottery drawing night will be at the March 25, 2024 meeting!!!







We are excited to participate in the 2024 Brown Bag Mystery Program!

- . The only fabric you can see is the feature fabric. The rest of the fabrics in the kit coordinate with the feature fabric.
- One "Clue" is revealed every 2 weeks starting March 1, 2024. Each clue is a portion of the quilt.
- The pattern is easy enough for a "Confident Beginner".

The 2024 PPQG Quilt Challenge

Our April 2024 challenge is based on your initials (Not your name). You will be designing a quilt incorporating your initials in the design.

There are three design categories:

- 1. Quilt design, decorative stitch, or embellishment
- 2. Technique or block name
- 3. Color or fabric motif

Use one initial for each category. Be creative!

Here are examples:

Barbara Ellen Noble

B could be a butterfly (embellishment) E could be ecru (color) N could a nine patch (block name)

Angelia Marrie Townsend

A could be an animal print (fabric motif) M could be meandering (quilt design) T could be Tall Ships (block name)

If you need help thinking of ideas, Quilters Cache has an alphabetical list of block names, and colorize.com and Wikipedia both have alphabetized lists of color names.

Quilts can be anything from miniature to lap-size. Cost to participate is the \$5.00 entry fee. Enter as many times as you wish. The Top five entries will receive cash prizes. Start working on those ideas!
