will be telling us all the things the Judges are looking for! And let me tell you! Our Quilts ARE Good enough to be in a judged quilt show!



- We will accept books and patterns that are recently published

It would be greatly appreciated if you would take a few minutes to

- Trim any frayed fabric edges
- Press and fold the fabric
- Label the fabric yardage and put it in a baggie

Items we are **not taking** for this Quilt Show.

- No Magazines
- No Old Books
- No Scraps less than fat eighth size unless they are packaged together by color (scraps did not sell successfully at the last Quilt Show)
- If you wish to pass these items along, consider bringing them for the Free Table at our Guild meetings.

If you send your donations in a container that you would like returned to you, please put your name on the container/lid.

GUIDELINES FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES

1. Each entry requires a separate Entry Form. Copy or print as many as you need.

- 2. Quilts may only be submitted by an active member of the Pieces & Patches Quilt Guild.
- 3. Quilts must be made by a guild member in order to be eligible for the "People's Choice" Award.

4. Forms must be received by the end of August 30, 2024.

As there are a limited number of racks to accommodate large quits, large quits will be placed based on entry date (first come basis).

Members may enter more than one quilt in the show. If there is not sufficient room to accommodate all entries that have been submitted, you may be contacted to prioritize entries.

Quilts (other than miniatures) must have a 4%" hanging sleeve to enable hanging on the racks. (Miniatures will be pinned to curtains hanging from the racks.)

Each quilt must be submitted in its own cloth bag (one cloth bag per entry, regardless of the quilt size) and must have a label sewn or pinned to the cloth bag and back of the quilt with the person's name and the name of the quilt.

If quilt owner is interested in having their quilt FOR SALE, please mark the Quilt For Sale checkbox. This designation will be printed on the label. All transactions will be between quilt owner and buyer and do not involve PPQG.

HINTS FOR COMPLETING ENTRY FORM

1. Completing form electronically:

- a. Download the Excel version of the form.
- b. Click on each box to enter requested information.
- c. Insert a picture of the quilt.
- d. Save your file to whatever name you choose.

e. E-mail your document to rinelson2019@email.com

If submitting more than one guilt, download the form again (or edit your existing document) and save it to a new name.

2. Completing the form in hard copy :

- a. Download and print the form. Print one for each quilt you are entering.
- b. Please print legibly and complete the form.
- c. Attach a picture in the upper left corner. Picture does NOT need to be large or on special photo paper.

d. Submit your form to Renee Nelson at a guild meeting, mail it to 116 Edgewater Drive, Michigan Center, 49254, OR scan the completed document and email it to rineison2019@gmail.com.

Healthy Sewing

This is the first in a new series of articles in an effort to help you make healthy sewing habits, or break some unhealthy sewing habits. As quilters and those who sew, we make sure to maintain our sewing machines, keep our scissors and blades sharp, but do we take the extra effort to keep ourselves in tip-top shape? Listed below are some reminders of how to take care of ourselves while we sew and quilt.

• Use a comfortable chair at the correct height. The ideal chair should have an adjustable height. Your chair should be high enough that your shoulders and neck are relaxed when sewing, but not too high that you are looking down and hunching over.

• Sit properly. Straighten your back and relax your shoulders. Use the back of your chair for support if you need to, or use your core muscles to keep your back straight while sitting. Keep your feet flat on the floor, with knees and legs at a 90-degree angle.

• Relax your shoulders. Take some deep breaths, lower and release the tension in your shoulders. Do some shoulder and neck rolls. • Get up and move often. Get up every 20 minutes or so, and set a timer for yourself if needed. Position your ironing board across the room so it forces you to stand up often.

Take breaks often, move more, and get the blood flowing.

• Stretch, stretch, and stretch. Sitting makes your muscles tight and short, so stretching is

important. Start a routine of doing stretching exercises often.

• Avoid repetitive motions. Use a rotary cutter that feels comfortable in your hand, and that doesn't require you to grip it too tightly. Change out your blade often and use sharp fabric scissors. Pressing can also be hard on wrists, so take breaks if needed or don't press all at once, and use a lighter iron.

This can be presented any time between now and September, and please remember to put your name in permanent ink so that she knows who made which block. Thank you for all of your work for the Guild, Rita!

Friendship Star Quilt Block

Use bright, colorful batiks for Star and neutrals for background

Unfinished Block Size – 12 ¹ / ₂ "		
Main Print		
A - cut 1	4 ¹ / ₂ " x 4 ¹ / ₂ " square	
B - cut 2	5 1/8" x 5 1/8" square	
Background Print		
C - cut 4	4 ¹ / ₂ " x 4 ¹ / ₂ " square	
D-cut 2	5 1/8" x 5 1/8" square	

Block Assembly Instructions:

Step 1: Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the D background squares. Place a D square and a B square right sides together. Sew a 1/4" seam on each side of the marked line.






Step 2: Cut down the marked line. Open up the pieces and press the seam toward the darker fabric. Repeat for the remaining B and D squares for a total of four half square triangles.

Step 3: Trim half square triangles. For $12 \frac{1}{2}$ block, trim squares to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ blocks.

Step 4: Assemble quilt block in Rows as shown. After Rows are assembled, sew block together. Press row seams open.


