

Year-end summary of P&PQG 2023-2024

We had an overall good year. There was an average of 75 people at the monthly meetings at Ella Sharp Museum. We have 121 members at this writing. This is the year we plan our bi-annual quilt show to happen in October 2024.

We brought back our September potluck to meet and greet each other with an overwhelming number of people. We however lost a dear member, Sharon Bannister. There was a sale of her stash which brought in \$2000 towards our new quilt racks. We held 6 workshops with an average of 17 attendants each.

We are very fortunate to have some spacious venues for our workshops: the Coop in Leslie, MI and the Toy House Community Room in Jackson, MI. There was one retreat in May at Creative Passions in Chesaning, MI. 23 people attended. Day camp was a new concept that was very well attended. It consists of two, one day-time days. Lunch and dinner are provided so the

campers can have sewing and social time. An average of 12 people enjoy this new time.

In March, we also brought back the National Quilt Day celebration. A lot of members and some non-members enjoyed a daylong of classes taught by our own members and enjoyed a very yummy pot luck.

There are 12 advertisers supporting our guild. We really appreciate them. We run their ads in our newsletter and at each in person meeting on the screen. We encourage our members to support them.

There are three Charities that we support yearly. 1. Together we can make a Difference House-children and teens--Christmas stockings (1789), Bibs (12), Quilts (3), Baby Blankets (8), Burp Cloths (34); 2. Cage Comforter for Jackson County Animal Shelter-dogs (6) and cats (33); and 3. Jackson Child Advocacy Center for abused children and teens-Quilts (120). We take a monetary love offering for each charity in the Spring/Summer months.

Currently we use GoDaddy and HostGator websites. We have website backups, security health, server downtime, software and plugin updates to keep our communications services up to date and running smoothly. We are always using ways to optimize use of the website.

At each of our monthly membership meetings we continue to record the show and tell items made by our guild members. As the year closes, the yearend reports are updated to individualize each board members job. There is a record retention policy in place for the website and each area of record.

Each month before our meetings, there are demonstrations of various ways to enrich our knowledge of short cuts or new techniques. Our members have so many talents to offer each other.

Due to member input and winter months of possible bad weather, we decided to have our January and February presenters via zoom. We had a wonderful calendar of speakers including Jenny Doan in January via zoom, and also Meg Cox in February via zoom.

Facebook is very well received by our members. So far everyone that can is able to access our members only Facebook page. We can list any special meetings or announcements. This was so helpful in advertising our quilt show in 2022, that we reached a large enough area of people to bring in over 600 attendees. As of Sept 18, 2024 we have 718 followers on Facebook.

We have a very active suggestion box. These are reviewed at board meetings and responses are posted in quarterly newsletters. A suggestion was asked if there are any exercise/stretches for sewing and quilting. An article is now included in the newsletter quarterly.

An annual financial review of the 2023-24 fiscal year was completed by guild treasurer and two board directors. All transactions were found to be in compliance with Guild/accounting policies and that the annual financial review was approved by the executive board.

We continue to have very informative newsletters that are published quarterly. These are emailed to members that can print them or put them in a file on their personal computer. Also, they are mailed to those who don't have a computer or email.

In closing, we have a great group of members that are doing a wonderful job of making sure the guild is running smoothly, professionally and with a lot of enthusiasm. Thank you to all our members for participating in these wonderful programs and meetings. We appreciate YOU!!

Healthy Sewing -- Eye Health

It doesn't matter whether you are working on 5-minute crafts or large month-long quilting projects, good lighting is important to lessen eye strain and keep you happily quilting and sewing for longer. Good lighting: Poor lighting will make you squint, which can lead to headaches and fatigue when quilting, sewing and crafting. More importantly, poor lighting leads to "leaning" in to see better. No matter what job we're working at, we always want to "bring our work to us" rather than bringing our eyes, neck and shoulders down to our work. Readers, cheaters and bifocals help with this, but good lighting is essential.

Types of lighting: Natural lighting is always optimal for crafting, sewing or any focused work. If you have big picture windows, positioning yourself by these can be a really big help. On cloudy days, you need to replicate natural or focused light within your working area. Instead of just switching on your living room light, you'll need a bright light that will ease your eye strain as you work and highlight the area you are working in.

- 1. Invest in adjustable LED lighting to avoid working in dark spaces
- 2. Always have task lighting for focus in other rooms
- 3. Take your lighting with you as you craft Save your eyes! Use the 20-20-20 rule. Every 20 minutes take a 20-second break and focus your eyes on something at least 20 feet away. This will help reduce eye strain, which in turn will reduce headaches.

Instead of bringing your head down to your work, bring your work up to your eyes. There are products available that you can place your work on that will bring it closer and allow you to rest your arms as well.

You can use magnified lighting or dollar store reading glasses to bring work closer still.

All blocks must be turned in prior to the beginning of the night's meeting at designated entrance table.


Members can enter up to 3 completed blocks. Please turn in a piece of paper with each entry for the drawing. A member will be able to win once per drawing.
