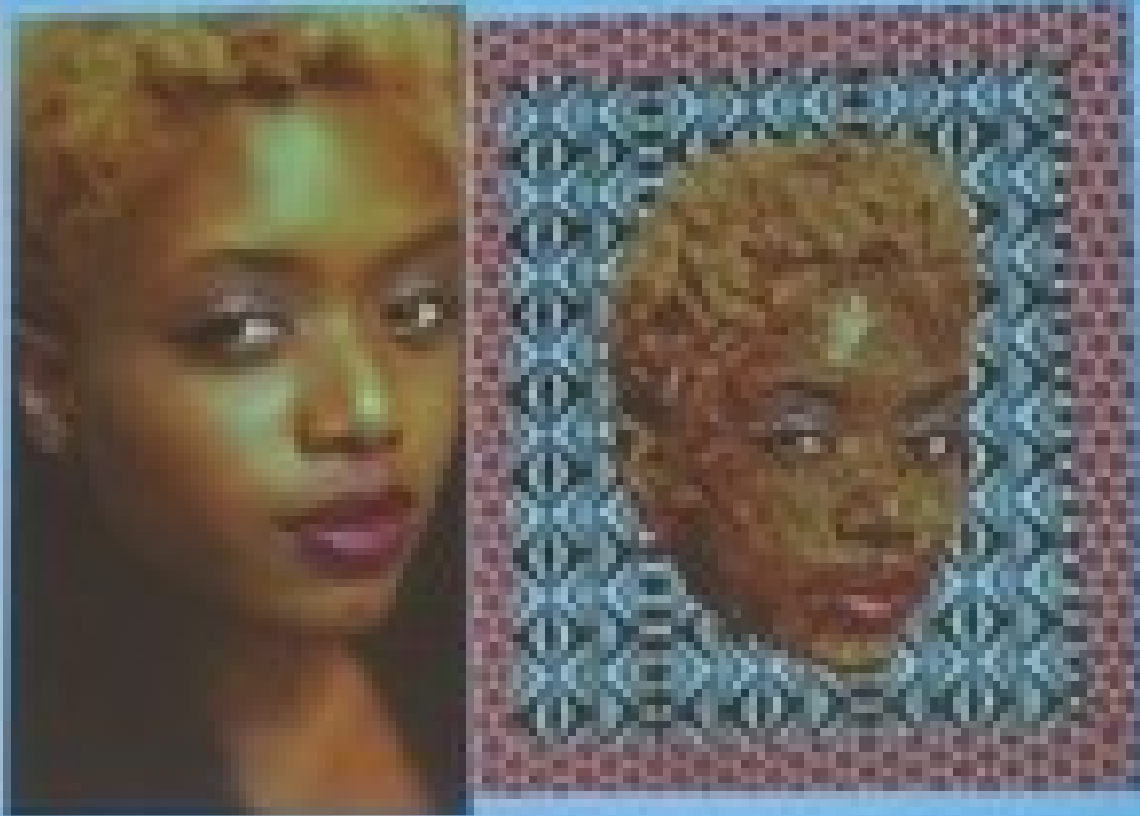




Portrait quilt of

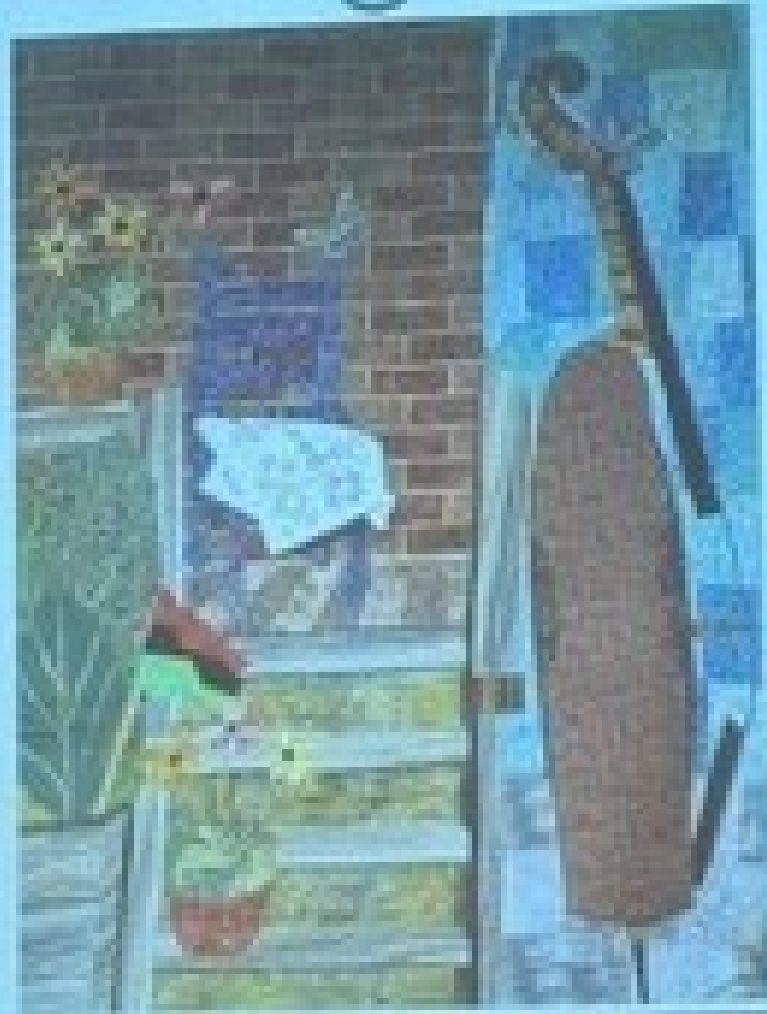

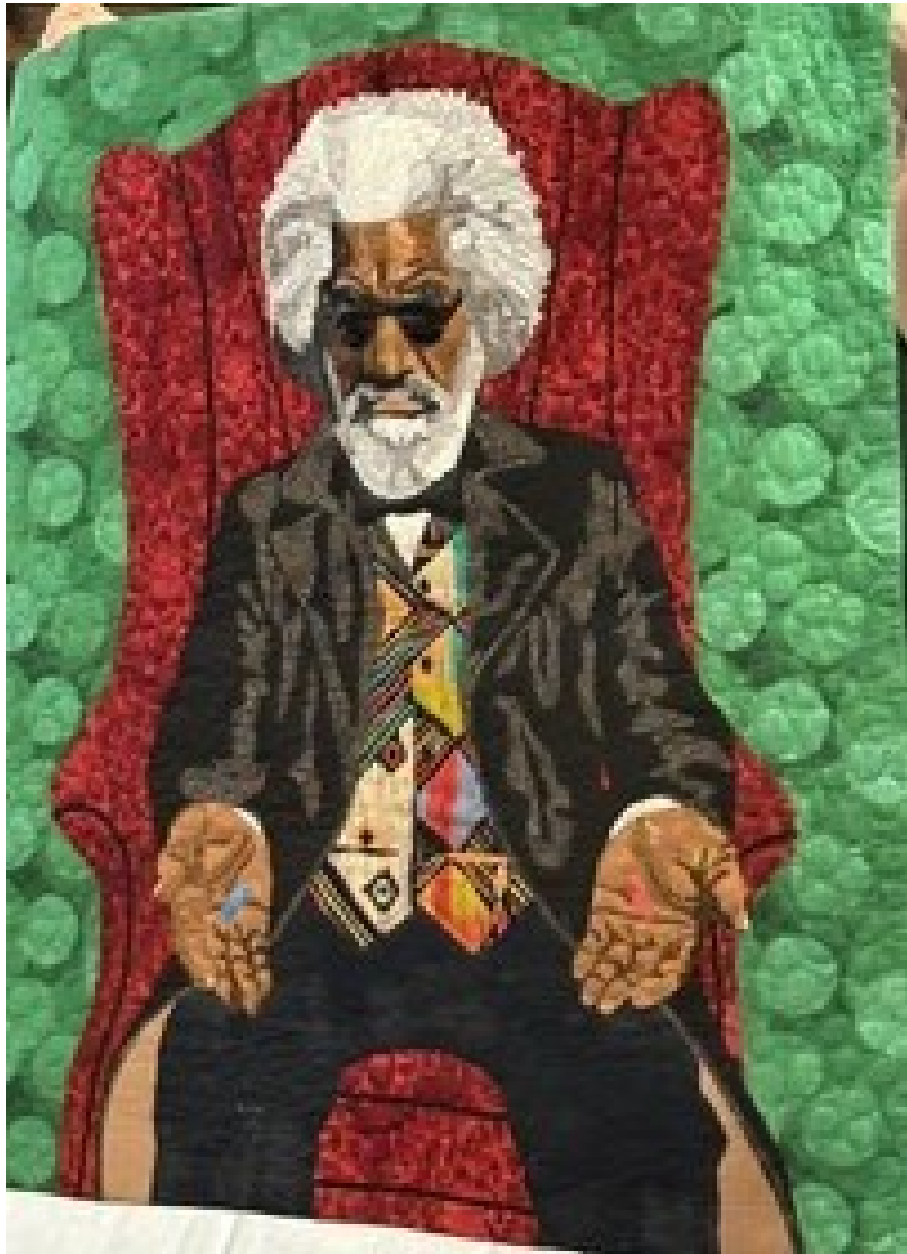

"Free Bird" and "The Seeker" are two soft sculptures mixed media pieces. Each stand 18.4 inches tall.

All of my sculptures have movable joints, allowing them to be positioned in many different ways.

"Free Bird & the Seeker"

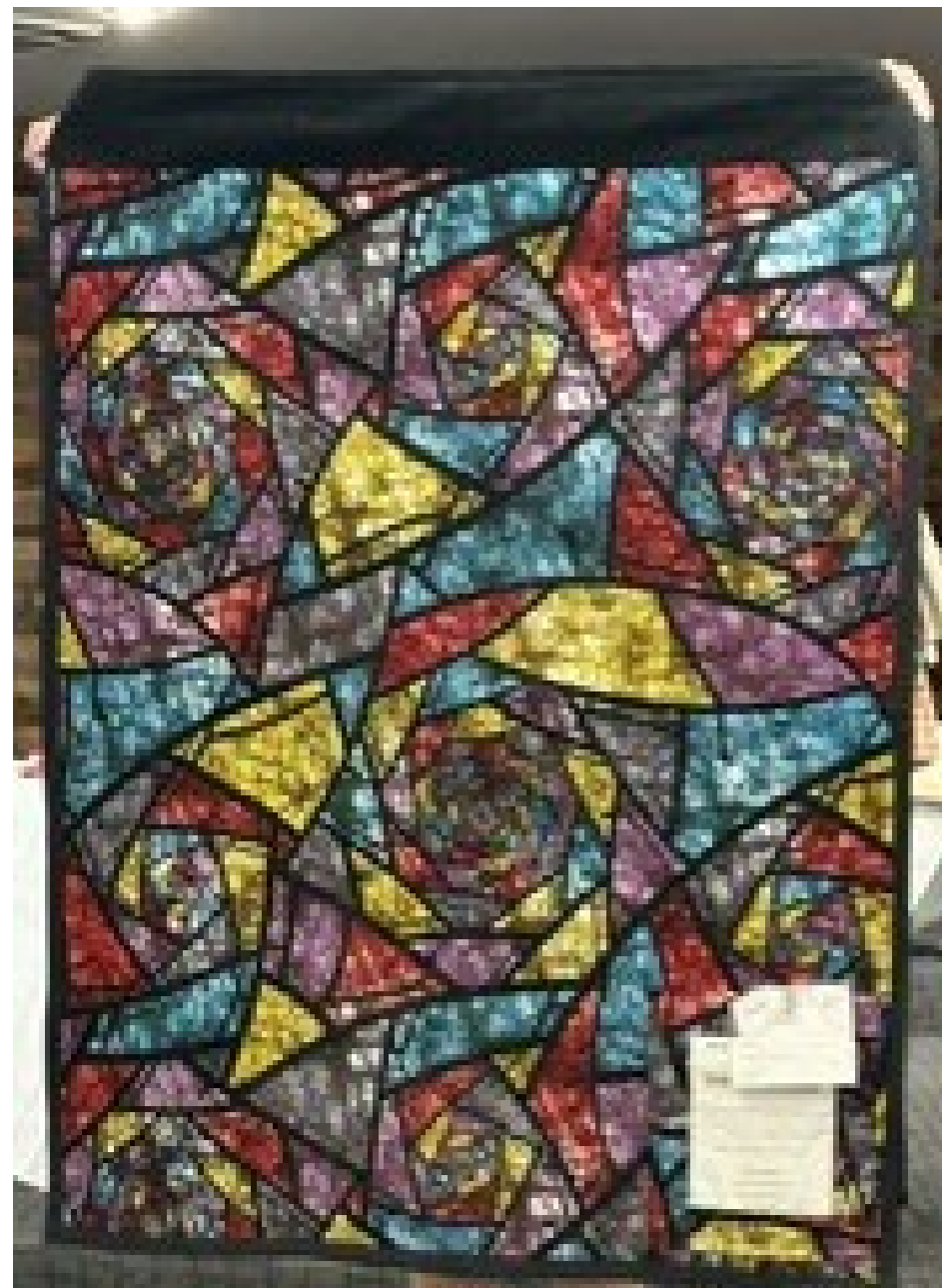


This mixed media piece reimagine Harriet Tubman as a Jedi warrior, drawing a connection between her real-world courage and the mythic power of a guardian who moves through darkness guided by an inner light. Like a Jedi, Tubman relied on intuition, discipline, and an unshakable belief in freedom as she led her people to safety.

Her "Force" was faith, strategy, and unwavering resolve. This work debuted in a Symposium and Cycle at Michigan State University and is currently featured in a Symposium: We Are Still Here at South Contemporary Art Center in Charleston, SC. By merging history with fiction, I honor Harriet as both a liberator and a visionary whose strength transcends time.

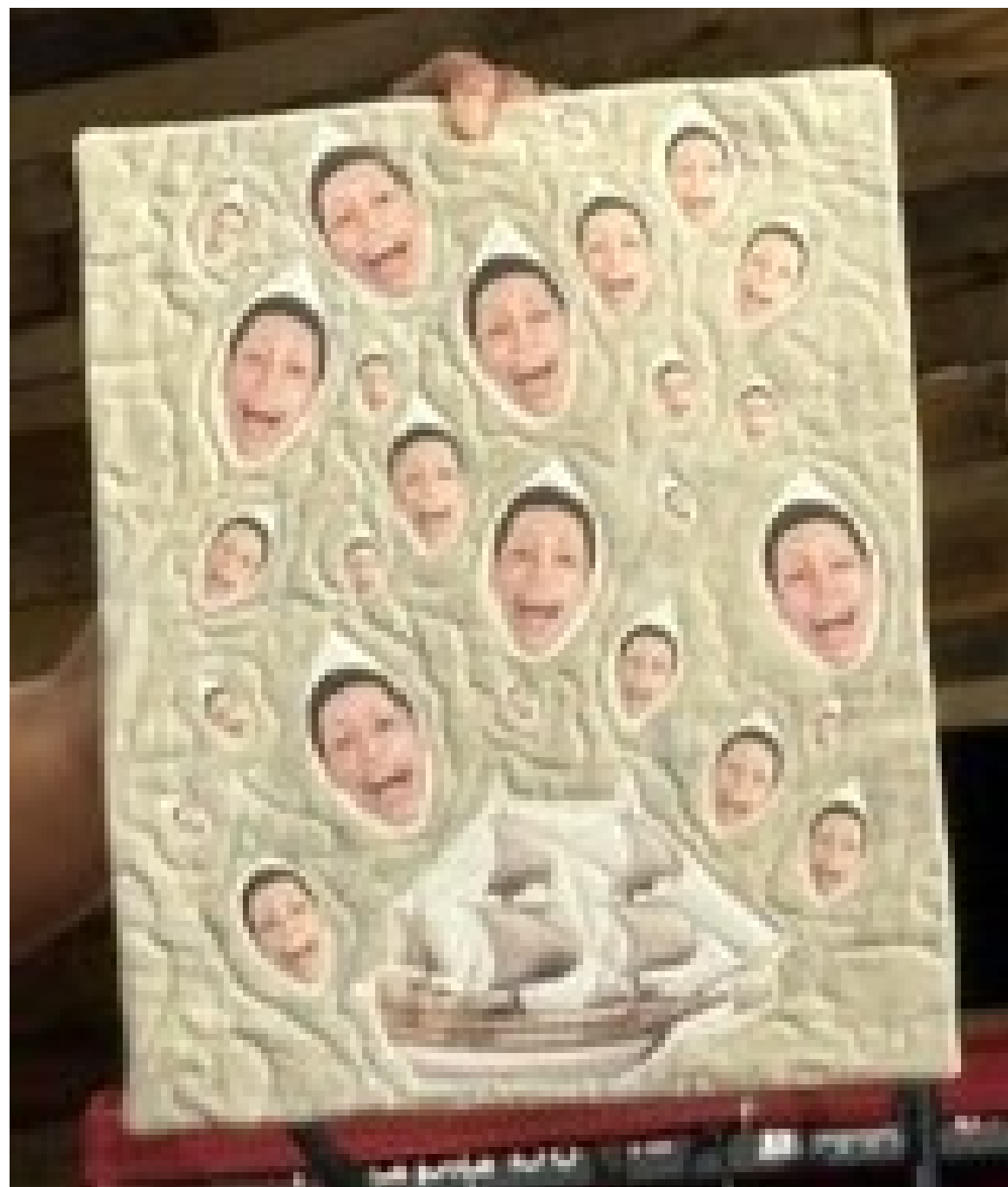
