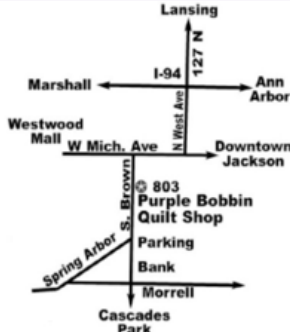

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Blotto Night

At our November guild meeting we will have our annual Blotto block exchange, so there is plenty of time to start sewing this fun quilt block.

Blotto Rules and Procedures

All blocks must be turned in prior to the beginning of the night's meeting at designated entrance table.

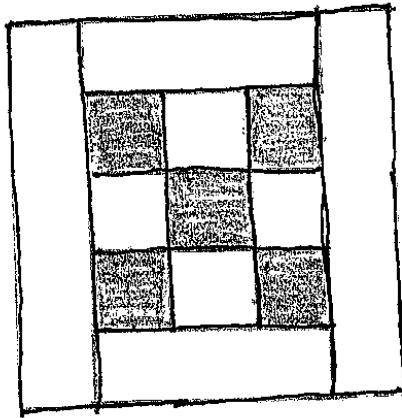
Members can enter up to 3 completed blocks. Please turn in a piece of paper with each entry for the drawing. A member will be able to win once per drawing.

If you are unable to attend the meeting, blocks may be sent with a representative for blotto night. Please use quality quilt fabric, not craft fabric. First winner drawn gets the first choice of the block groupings. The more participation, the more blocks and winners!

Color: Happy scrappy colors

Blocks:

Color #1: Five 2 ½" square blocks
Color #2: Four 2 ½" square blocks,
Two 2 ½" x 6 ½" blocks and Two 2 ½" x 10 ½" inch blocks.



Now assemble your block: Start with the nine-patch block. Color #1 will be in the corner and center. Color #2 added to make the nine-patch. Completed 9 patch should measure 6 ½" square. Add 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips to the top and bottom. Then sew long strips, 2 ½" x 10 ½" inch, to each side. You are done!!! You can make up to 3 blocks for the block lottery.

Name Tag Directions

"Night and Noon"

Official Logo Block of Pieces and Patches Quilt Guild

Follow the piecing order given, using the same fabric for each number. Use muslin or a light color for the large square in "Unit C". This is where your name will go. Use a strong contrasting color for the 5's, as they are the star points. (It doesn't matter which 5 you sew on first.)

After sewing the parts, sew Unit C to Unit D; sew Unit A to one side, and Unit B to the other side, matching seams carefully. (There may be some distortion in the pattern from copying. Adjust if necessary.) After piecing the block, embroider or write your name with permanent ink in the center square.

Place completed block on batting (or fleece) and backing. Baste or pin in place. Quilt in the ditch by

hand or machine to outline star and center square. Finish with 1/4-inch binding.

Wear with pride to Pieces and Patches Quilt Guild Meetings.

Quilt Show General Store Donations

We will once again have a General Store where we sell donated quilting items, raising funds to support the operations and programs of the guild. The proceeds of the quilt show, are our primary fund raiser held every two years, to support the budget for the next 2 years.

Where do the donations come from? From community donations and from the guild membership. As we take in donations, we will offer items to be used by the charities as appropriate.

We need your help! Please start looking through your stash for good/saleable donations of fabric, notions, kits, etc. ... things that you may no longer want or need that another quilter may treasure.

Donation Guidelines

- ☐ 100% quilting cotton, flannel, fleece, wool, or other fabrics used in quilting or bag making fabric is preferred.
- ☐ Fabric must be clean and free from odors, stains, etc.
- ☐ Fabric can be prewashed but not required.
- ☐ If edges are frayed, please trim the fray.
- ☐ Please press and fold fabric yardage
- ☐ Labeling fabric with yardage and putting it in a baggie would be an immense help! This is how we package and organize the fabric at the show.
- ☐ Fabric may also be put into bundles, e.g., Fat Quarters that coordinate.
- ☐ We will accept scraps over 3" in size.
- ☐ This year, we will accept yarn in the original package only.
- ☐ Books and patterns accepted, with consideration for the age/usefulness.
- ☐ No magazines will be accepted.
- ☐ If you send your donations in a container that you would like returned to you, please put your name on the container (and on the lid if there is one)

There are three of us on the General Store Committee: Maureen Peterson, Joy Pine, and myself. With the volume of donations that we have had in recent years your assistance in prepping your donations (tidying up, measuring, bagging) is appreciated!

I am accepting donations now. You can either bring your donations to a Guild meeting or contact me to arrange a pickup.

She will share what's new and upcoming from Creative Grids® line of rulers and has lots on hand on to share. I believe she has some "sneak previews" of new rulers to share with us.



We also are welcoming Nancy Roelfsema back to our Guild. She will be teaching a Free Motion Quilting Workshop at The Coop in Leslie, MI on September 30, 2026, 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM (please arrive by 8:30 to set up) If you haven't taken any workshops (or gone

to one of her retreats) you have missed out on a wonderful experience. I had so many requests at the Quilt as You Go workshop, that we locked her in for this free motion quilting workshop before we let her leave!!

From Nancy's workshop webpage. "Learn the free-motion quilting skills and designs needed to quilt your own quilts on your domestic machine. Many quilters find themselves frozen in fear at the quilting stage of their projects, so I will help you get past this fear with skills and designs that give you the confidence you need to start. In this class, Nancy will bring many samples, so you can see a large variety of quilting designs and see how they can be incorporated into your own quilts. We will be sketching many designs, so you will have them handy for your future creations. We will also cover the tools that will make this stage of your quilt successful: machine options and setup, machine feet, needles, threads, battings, and other tools."

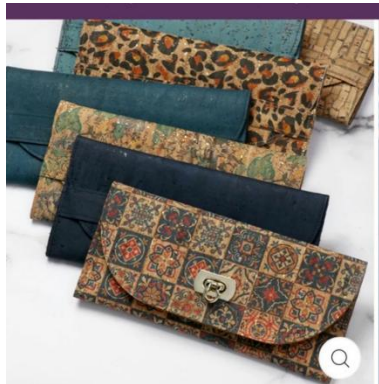

In October we will have a presentation by Patty Greening. She is a former Sally Tomato certified teacher. Her program is titled: Bag Making for Beginners. “Are you looking for a fun, creative, and rewarding new hobby? Have you ever wanted to make your own bags? It’s more than just sewing; it’s an opportunity to make something truly unique, for yourself and others.

I’m excited to share with you my knowledge of Bag Making and the materials and supplies needed for creating them. We will debunk myths that you need a special machine to sew with cork and faux leather. I will bring samples of different cork and leather bags to share with you. Patty”



She will also be teaching a Workshop for the Luck Penny Wallet by Sally Tomato, it will be held at The Coop in Leslie from 12:00 PM – 4:00 PM on October 26, 2026. You can bring your own materials or she will have kits available, Leather wallet kits will sell for \$25 and cork kits will be \$35.

In November, our very own member Maureen Peterson will be our speaker. Maureen’s sewing experience has been dubbed “Another Gen X Sewing Journey”. Her style is a mismatch of tailor-taught traditional techniques mixed with trial-by-fire and an “I can do anything” attitude. If you are familiar with the



stereotypes of Generation X you will agree that they are known to be self-deprecating and “X-treme”, Maureen’s projects will not disappoint in that regard! Be sure to join us in person Monday, November 30th as we stroll through the mundane and into the wild side of Maureen’s sewing journey.

A look toward a 2027 Workshops!



I know next March and April are a long way off but I want you to be thinking about it so you can be ready for this workshop. Our March presentation will be by our new member, Anita Liberman-Lampear. It is titled ART QUILT-FISH! (March 29,

2027) and we will have a 2-part workshop (April 17th & May 8th, 2027) where you will be creating your own art quilt “fish”. If you want to go on to create a quilt based on a photograph this is where you learn that technique. Anita will teach the 2-part workshop, assisted by Dawn Fowler, who took her class at Ann Arbor Sewing Center. The cost will be \$110 total. A supply list will be made available when you register. Sign up will be available soon. There is a minimum of 8 students and a maximum of 15. Start putting aside those scraps of fabrics – think colorful, scales, fins, gills and underwater!

The President's Block for Cindy Fraher is the double 4 patch. Her request is blue solids or prints coupled with white solids or white on white. She would prefer no batiks. Please safety pin your name to the block. Do NOT write on the block.

For 1 block, you will need:

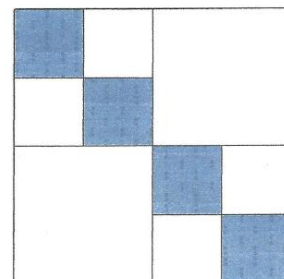
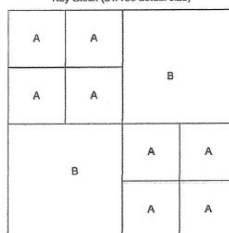
2 white $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ squares

4 blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ squares

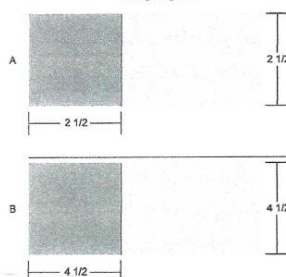
4 white $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ squares.

Double Four Patch

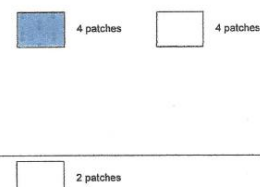

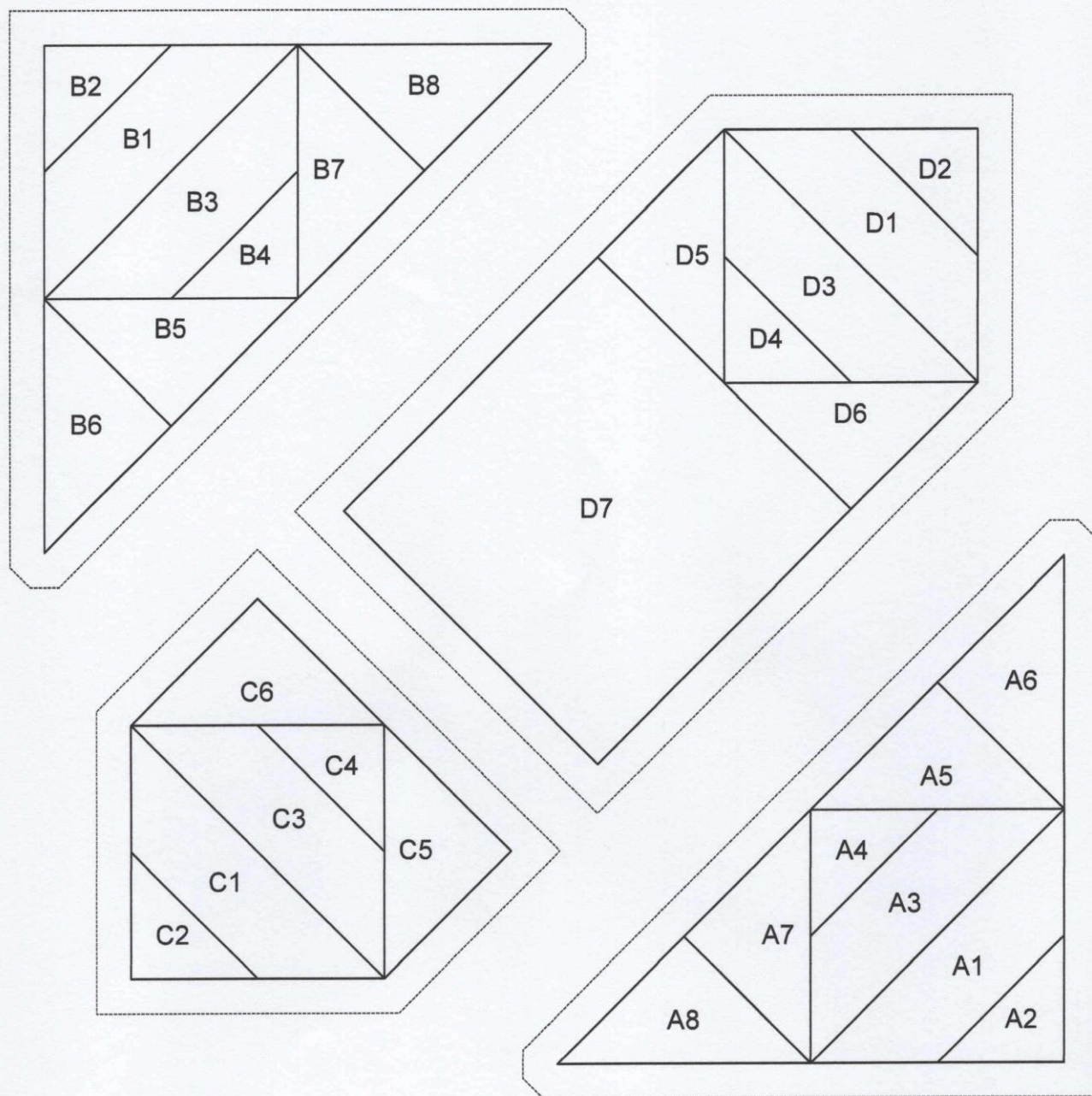

GUIDELINES FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES

1. Each entry requires a separate Entry Form. Copy or print as many as you need.
2. Quilts may only be submitted by an active member of the Pieces & Patches Quilt Guild.
3. Quilts must be made by a guild member in order to be eligible for the "People's Choice" Award.
4. Forms must be received by the end of August 31, 2026.
5. As there are a limited number of racks to accommodate large quilts, large quilts will be placed based on entry date (first come basis). Due to space limitations and available racks, a quilt may not be hung.
6. Members may enter more than one quilt in the show. If there is not sufficient room to accommodate all entries that have been submitted, you may be contacted to prioritize entries.
7. Quilts (other than miniatures) must have a 4½" hanging sleeve to enable hanging on the racks. (Miniatures will be pinned to curtains hanging from the racks.)
8. Each quilt must be submitted in its own cloth bag/pillowcase (one cloth bag/pillowcase per entry, regardless of the quilt size) and must have a label sewn or pinned to the cloth bag/pillowcase and back of the quilt with the person's name and the name of the quilt.
9. If quilt owner is interested in having their quilt FOR SALE, please mark the Quilt For Sale checkbox. This designation will be printed on the label. All transactions will be between quilt owner and buyer and do not involve PPQG.

HINTS FOR COMPLETING ENTRY FORM

1. Completing form **electronically**:
 - a. Download the Excel version of the form.
 - b. Click on each box to enter requested information.
 - c. Insert a picture of the quilt.
 - d. Save your file to whatever name you choose.
 - e. [E-mail your document to rjnelson2019@gmail.com](mailto:rjnelson2019@gmail.com)
 - f. If submitting more than one quilt, download the form again (or edit your existing document) and save it to a new name.
2. Completing the form in **hard copy**:
 - a. Download and print the form. Print one for each quilt you are entering.
